## College of DuPage/Lewis University 3+1 Program in Criminal Justice

- Step One:** Complete a 3+1 Transfer Application at the Admissions Office at the College of DuPage (example-page 6).
- Step Two:** Following the Bachelor of Arts Criminal Justice 3+1 Curriculum Sheet (page 4) begin studies at the College of DuPage in the Associate of Arts curriculum.
- Step Three:** As part of the AA, enroll in the 6 COD Criminal Justice courses required for the program (Intro to Criminal Justice, Criminology, Juvenile Delinquency, Introduction to Corrections, Police and Society, and Multiculturalism and Diversity in Criminal Justice (page 4).
- Step Four:** One-to-two semesters before completion of the AA degree, submit an Admissions Application to Lewis University (<https://admissions.lewisu.edu/apply/>).
- Step Five:** Once admitted to Lewis University, **submit the \$150 Tuition Deposit and schedule your Student Orientation, Advising and Registration (SOAR) appointment** to register for Lewis University courses.
- Step Six:** After Lewis course registration, register to third-year courses at COD. A total of seven (21 credit hours) COD classes are taken while enrolled the first two (2) semesters with Lewis.
- Step Seven:** If applying for financial aid, submit a Registration Statement from the Cashier's Office at COD to Financial Aid Services at Lewis University.

Students may elect to lighten their course loads during the first four semesters and beyond by taking some of their COD courses over summer sessions.

Students have the option of pursuing the Homeland Security Certificate for the third-year hours or any other COD 1000 or above elective course.

Students can elect to take up to three graduate courses (italicized) in place of the required undergraduate courses as part of the Baccalaureate to Master's Program.

**Please note all COD coursework must be completed before the student's final Lewis year.**

## Lewis University Baccalaureate to Master's Option

During Year 4, students have an opportunity to apply to the Baccalaureate to Master's program. Upon admission to the program, students may substitute up to three Criminal Justice graduate courses (see italicized coursework on the previous page) for three Criminal Justice undergraduate courses. Tuition for the graduate coursework will be charged at the 3+1 tuition rate and financial aid will apply. After conferral of the bachelor's degree if the student continues to the graduate program in Criminal Justice, s/he can complete the program in one year if the student completed three graduate courses as an undergraduate student. Additionally, the student will be given a 20% Frequent Flyer tuition discount. The Frequent Flyer discount combined with the 3+1 tuition pricing reduces the entire program over 40%. # Important Program Information

## Registration Qualifications

The 3+1 program is built upon the student having **71** completed hours as part of the AA degree at COD prior to the student beginning their Lewis courses. The AA degree is 64-66 hours, so **5-7 additional elective hours must be taken before entry to Lewis.**

Lewis does not run courses over the summer, but the additional third-year COD credit may be taken during the summer semesters.

All College of DuPage courses must be completed the semester **prior** to the student's last Lewis semester. **Students may not be enrolled in any COD courses while in their Lewis graduating semester.**

## Graduation Honors

Per catalog policy, students earning less than 56 Lewis hours are not eligible for honors distinction at graduation. Since the 3+1 program consists of 36 Lewis hours, 3+1 students are not eligible to receive honors distinction. However, a student eligible and inducted into the Lewis University Criminal Justice honor society, Alpha Phi Sigma, will be recognized at commencement with this honors achievement.

# What You Need to Know....

## Fees

Fees charged for special services are published in the online [University Course Schedule](#) each semester. Each semester, a financial information section is also published in the [University Course Schedule](#). This information is available to all students at the time of registration for any term. Students may obtain a copy at the Office of the Registrar.

## Refund Policy (Course Drop / Withdrawal)

The following policies refer to all registered courses (classroom-based, online, blended, practicum, research, clinical, student teaching, field experience, and independent study). Definition of a week: A week begins at **12:00 am, Monday, CST; ends at 11:59 pm, Sunday, CST**.

### Sixteen Week Courses

Drop within the first week: 100% refund, course does not appear on the transcript.

Drop within the second week: 50% refund, course does not appear on the transcript.

Withdraw by the end of tenth week: no refund, "W" grade placed on transcript. No withdrawals will be processed after the beginning of the eleventh week.

## Veterans Benefits

Lewis University is proud to be a Yellow Ribbon school and recognized by GI Jobs as a Military friendly school. Lewis accepts all VA programs and Military Tuition Assistance. Aviation Flight costs are typically covered. Zero application fee for military.

## Tuition Deferment for Sworn Officers

If your department provides reimbursements for educational expenses, you can elect to defer your tuition payment to 6 weeks beyond the end of the term - giving your employer time to verify your grades before reimbursing your tuition. This option is not automatic. To take advantage of the "Tuition Payment Agreement", students must complete and submit to the Business Office the Sworn Officer Tuition Promissory Note for each semester enrolled prior to the start of each semester (including the first semester of enrollment). The Sworn Officer Tuition Promissory Note can be found in the Student Account tab of the MyLewis account.

## Purchasing Textbooks

You will need to order/purchase textbooks for your classes. This can be done through the "Bookstore" under "quick links" by entering your course numbers. You can also order them over the phone at 815-836-5401. The bookstore is located at the Romeoville Campus in De La Salle Hall (1<sup>st</sup> floor).

## Holds on Account

If you have a **HOLD** on your account that is preventing you from registering, please refer to the following:

**Business Office Hold:** This hold is often due to an outstanding balance in the Business Office and/or incomplete necessary paperwork in Financial Aid, so you will need to contact the Business Office and/or Financial Aid Services Office. The Business Office may be reached at [businessoffice@lewisu.edu](mailto:businessoffice@lewisu.edu) and the Financial Aid Services at [finaid@lewisu.edu](mailto:finaid@lewisu.edu).

**Collection-Internal-Hold:** Contact the Business Office at [businessoffice@lewisu.edu](mailto:businessoffice@lewisu.edu).

**Admission Hold:** We may not have received your final transcript from your prior institution. Contact your Admission counselor in the Admission Office or call 815-836-5250

**Health Services Hold:** Call 815-836-5455 or stop by Health Services to see what you need to do. You may need to submit paperwork or you may have to have an immunization to become compliant with state laws. Some of the older immunizations have expired, so a new one may need to be taken.

## Frequent Flyer Discount (applicable for the Baccalaureate to Master's Option)

University alumni qualify for a 20% tuition discount when admitted into an eligible graduate degree, doctoral degree, second bachelor's degree or credit-bearing certificate program.

## Apply for Graduation

Prior to the beginning of your final semester, you must apply for graduation. Here are the steps to apply:

## Criminal Justice

### Baccalaureate-to-Master’s Program (MSCSJ)

Justice, Law and Public Safety Studies (JLPSS) offers the Baccalaureate-to-Masters for qualified undergraduate majors in Criminal Justice, Forensic Criminal Investigation and Paralegal Studies

#### Baccalaureate-to-Master’s Program MSCSJ (Master of Science in Criminal Justice)

##### Benefits:

- Complete Masters in less time than if the two programs – Bachelor’s and Master’s degrees - were taken separately
- With planning, the MSCSJ could be awarded within one year of graduating with the Bachelor's degree
- Nine (9) graduate hours may be used to complete the Bachelor’s degree (128 hours) and to satisfy specific course requirements for the Master’s program (36 graduate hours required)
- After seventy-five (75) undergraduate credit hours are completed, and achievement of an overall GPA of 3.0, students are eligible to apply for the Baccalaureate to Master’s Program
- Graduate tuition is charged at the 3+1 rate as an undergraduate student and undergraduate financial aid will apply
- Receive a Frequent Flyer discount of 20% on the graduate tuition as a full-time graduate student
- Baccalaureate-to-Master’s Program application is available on MyLewis, Records and Registration, Academic Information

#### Baccalaureate-to-Master’s Program (Master of Science in Criminal Justice)

##### Qualifications and Requirements:

- Qualified students may apply graduate courses to the 18-hour semester when they take select graduate courses
- Take nine (9) credit hours of approved graduate courses in Criminal Justice in their senior year, and earn a “B” or better in each course
- Take 27 more credit hours of remaining core and elective courses
- Pass a comprehensive examination
- Students accepted in the Baccalaureate to Master’s Program are required to apply for admission to MSCSJ

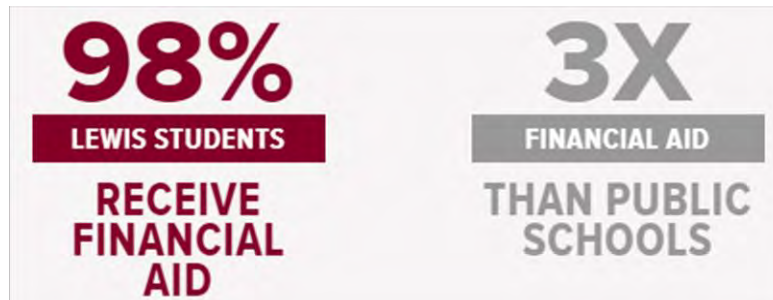

# FINANCIAL AID



3+1 Students are billed at a 35% tuition discount from current per-credit hour tuition. Due to the significant reduction in tuition pricing and the additional credit hours allowed to transfer towards the third year, Admissions Office Academic/Merit Scholarships do not apply to 3+1 program students. However, all federal, state and private scholarships can be awarded to eligible students. Through financial aid and other benefits, students receive a private education at Lewis University for less than the cost of a state or public university.

Once admitted to Lewis, financial aid will be processed by Lewis for both Lewis University and College of DuPage tuition charges. However, **College of DuPage will no longer recognize students as part of the financial aid program at COD and students will no longer be placed on the deferred payment plan.** When students register for their third-year coursework at COD, they are subject to COD's 24-hour rule for payment or risk being dropped from coursework. Once Lewis processes financial aid and aid has been applied to Lewis charges any financial aid credits can be reimbursed to students for out-of-pocket tuition paid to College of DuPage.

Michael had two dreams, both of which he achieved. One was to be a soldier and the other was to be a Chicago Police Officer. He achieved more in his short 30 years than most people do in a lifetime. He will always be loved and never forgotten by his family and friends.

Through the Michael P. Gordon Foundation, Michael's family carries on Michael's legacy and hopes to assist other young men and women who have a dream to become a police officer.
